INSTRUCTIONS

1. Your exam should have a total of six (6) pages (including this one) containing two essay questions.
2. The exam is written to be completed in three hours. However, you will be given one flex-exam day, from approximately 8:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., to complete the exam. The extra time, while not needed, should allow you to identify the issues presented better, write better, budget your time better, and obey the word limit.
3. The two questions are not weighted equally. The weight of each question is listed below the question's heading and is equivalent to the suggested amount of time, in minutes, to spend on that particular question.
4. You may type the exam or write the exam in a bluebook. If you decide to type, please double-space your answers and set all margins to one-inch. If you decide to write, please write on only one side of your blue book pages and try to write legibly.
5. Your name should not appear anywhere on your answers. The examination questions are to be returned with your answers. Your exam number must be placed on both the examination and each blue book or answer sheet.
6. The text of your exam answers, in total, cannot exceed 3,000 words. At the end of your exam, indicate the number of words you used. This indication of word count is excluded from the 3,000 word limitation.
7. The exam is limited open-book, open note in that while taking the exam you may reference only this course's casebook, casebook supplement, any material posted on this course's blog, any version of Title 17 of the U.S. Code, and any notes to which you personally made some contribution.
8. If you really think you need further information in order to be able to answer a question, you should state what that information is and why you think you need it. It is not sufficient to merely state that further information is needed.
