Causes

1. Power and Control: Rape is often a way for men to exert power and control over women. 2. Social Norms: Rape is often a result of social norms that encourage men to be aggressive and women to be passive. 3. Alcohol and Drugs: Rape is often a result of alcohol and drug use, which can impair judgment and increase aggression. 4. Peer Pressure: Rape is often a result of peer pressure, where men are encouraged to be aggressive and women are encouraged to be passive.



Is every raped a serial rapist?

Media that victim blame report has been shown to increase the risk of revictimization. (Lynch & Cicchetti, 2001)

UNC, Chapel Hill

Causes

RAPE IS CAUSED BY A COMBINATION OF FACTORS, INCLUDING SOCIAL, CULTURAL, AND PSYCHOLOGICAL. IT IS NOT CAUSED BY A SINGLE FACTOR. IT IS A RESULT OF A COMPLEX INTERACTION OF FACTORS.
