INSTRUCTIONS

1. Your exam should have a total of X (X) pages (including this one) containing X multiple-choice questions and X essay questions. Before you begin, please check to make sure that your copy of the exam is complete.
2. The exam is written to be completed in three and one-half hours. However, you have four (4) hours to complete the exam. I suggest, but do not require, that you use the extra half-hour to carefully read the eighteen questions and identify the issues presented.
3. All questions are not weighted equally. The weight of each question is listed below the question's heading and is equivalent to the suggested amount of time, in minutes, to spend on that particular question. Questions 1-X are worth X points each, with a suggested time of X minutes each. Question X-X are worth X points each, with a suggested time of X minutes each.
4. Questions X are "multiple choice" questions. There are five (5) possible answers, lettered (a) to (e) for each question. Choose the best answer for each question and enter the answer into Exam4's multiple-choice entry sheet. **Please use Exam4's multiple-choice entry feature (selectable from the menu bar in Exam4).** For each question, there is only one "correct" answer. Enter only one answer for each question; you will not receive any credit for a question in which you enter more than one answer. There is no penalty for giving a wrong answer.
5. You must type the exam using Exam4.
6. You must submit your exam answers and return the exam within the four-hour exam period. You may take the exam anywhere in the law school.
7. Your name should not appear anywhere on your answers. Your exam number must be placed on the exam.
8. The exam is limited open-book, open note in that while taking the exam you may reference only this course's casebook and workbook, any material posted or linked to on this course's blog, and any notes to which you personally made some contribution.
