“Mini-projects”

This year we’re encouraging participants to bring their favorite un-explored (or under-explored) ideas relating to the intersection of legal technology and legal education. There will be an opportunity to pitch ideas for mini-projects that can be accomplished during the conference, and to break into exploratory tribes. We encourage not just ideation, but realization. Parts of the schedule will be devoted to reports of progress and demonstrations of results.

Mini-projects could include such things as:

- developing a best practices statement, or foundational guidance statements/thoughts/ideas about teaching tech/ teaching with tech;
- building an application using A2J Author;
- constructing a drone that delivers legal services or promotes law school enrollment.
